Naples, July 6.

**T**WO Battalions of the Queen's Regiment, quartered in Calabria; are ordered to march from thence to reinforce the Garrison of this City. For some Days past Mount Vesuvius has thrown out such large Quantities of inflammable Matter, that the Inhabitants of some of the adjacent Villages have been obliged to quit their Habitations, and retire to a greater Distance.

Constantinople, July 6. The Ramazan is finish'd, and Bairam has succeeded with great Tranquillity, but without any publick Shews or Spectacles being exhibited to the People, as was usual in the Reign of the late Sultan. The Ministers are preparing to give Treats, which will last for some Time. The Polish Envoy Extraordinary, Count Mnifzeck, will have his Audience of Leave of the Sultan and Vizir in a few Days, after which he will make his Dispositions for his Return, which it is thought will be some Time in August. The last Advices from Bassora, dated the 18th of April, say, that they have received authentick Accounts from Persia, that Carem Caun, who was in Possession of Spahan, had been defeated, and drove from thence by one Hossain Khan, Son of Fatteh Cadjar, who pretends to have one of the ancient Royal Family with him, and in whose Name he has taken Possession of that Place, and all the adjacent Country. The other Competitor, Azad Khan, is retired to his own Country, it is said, and has given over all Thoughts of Persia, at least for the Present. And Carem Caun is affirm'd to be arriv'd at Shyrash, whose Defeat has been very considerable, above two Thirds of his Officers being cut off. The Chiause Baschi is named to the three Tails, with a Paschalyck in Asia. He is to be replaced by the Son of Ivas Mehemet Pascha, who is absent, collecting the Estate of the late Cara Osman Oglu, who was cut off some Time ago at Smyrna. Other inferior Changes will of Course follow.

Vienna, July 18. Her Imperial Majesty having conferred on Count Caroli the Government of Croatia, he is preparing to set out, in order to take Possession of that important Post. Orders are given for some Regiments quartered in Hungary, to march from thence forthwith for Bohemia and Moravia.

Prague, July 19. 'Tis reported here, that the Troops quartered in the different Circles of this Kingdom have received Orders to hold themselves in Readiness to march, in order to form a Camp in the Neighbourhood of Konig-

gratz, but as yet no Provisions or Forage of any Kind whatsoever are getting together for their Subsistence.

Vienna, July 21. Their Imperial Majesties have been at Eisenstadt, Prince Esterhasi's Country House, since Monday last, but will return to Schonbrun this Evening. To-morrow is fixed for the Ceremony of Cardinal de Rodt's receiving the Barret from the Emperor's Hands. Prince Piccolomini arrived here some Days ago from Bohemia, from which Place Marshal Brown is expected in a Day or two.

Berlin, July 24. We hear that the King intends taking a Tour to Silesia the Beginning of next Month, and 'tis even said the Persons who are to accompany his Majesty are already named. Field Marshal Keith, Governor of this City, who has been for some Time past at Carlsbadt, drinking the Waters, is returned from thence to Potzdarn, by express Orders from his Majesty.

Brussels, August 3. Marechal de Belle Isle arrived at Compiagne Yesterday was Se'nnight with M. de Paulmy d'Argenson; but our Advices add, that they are soon to return to continue their Progress along the Sea Coast. The French Troops upon our Frontiers continue to remain quiet in their Quarters.
