Rome, August 3.

THE Corpse of the late Cardinal Mellini, the Imperial Minister at this Court, after lying in State three Days, was interred last Tuesday with great Funeral Pomp in the Church of Marcel, the Pope, and most of the Members of the Sacred College, assisting at the Obsequies. He has left handsome Legacies to the Hospitals in this City; and the Bulk of his Fortune, which is very considerable, goes to two Nieces; and to the Poor in case they die without Issue.

Leghorn, Aug. 4. A Genoese Polacre, bound for Corsica, having on board 300 Soldiers, was drove in here by contrary Winds on the 27th of last Month, but the Wind coming favourable the next Day, she put to Sea again for that Island.

Prague, Aug. 7. All the Troops that composed this Garrison, except three Battalions, are marched from hence for the Camp at Colin; and the Emperor's own Regiment, and that of General Count de Harfch, passed by this City the Beginning of this Week for the said Camp; from whence we learn, that two Magazines of Forage, lately formed for the Use of the Horse, were a few Days ago entirely consumed by Fire, in a Village near the Head Quarters.

Copenhagen, Aug. 8. On Tuesday last our East-India Company's Ship the Tranquebar arrived in this Road with a very valuable Cargo. And the Sale of her Merchandize, together with that of the Prince Frederick and Louisa, also lately arrived, is appointed to begin on the 6th of next Month.

Frankfort, Aug. 13. The Magistrates of this City have granted to the Protestants settled here, the Liberty of building two Churches for the Exercise of their Religion, under certain Restrictions, the one for the German, and the other for the French Protestants.

Inspruck, Aug. 14. Within this Fortnight past, upwards of 6000 Quintals of Gunpowder

have been taken out of the Magazines in this City, and sent into Bohemia and Moravia.

Vienna, Aug. 14. Marshal Brown, who arrived here from Bohemia on the 24th of last Month, set out from hence last Wednesday on his Return to that Kingdom, in order to take upon him the Command of the Body of Troops encamped near Colin.

Dresden, Aug. 18. Preparations are making at Court for the King's Journey to Poland, his Majesty having declared his Intentions of setting out for Warsaw the Beginning of next Month. We are assured by Letters from the Frontiers of Transilvania, that the Plague continues to make great Havock in those Parts.

Berlin, Aug. 19. We have received an Account, by our last Letters from Glogau, that General Moulin, Commandant of that Fortress, died there a few Days ago, in the 76th Year of his Age. Baron Saldern, whom the King has lately raised to the Rank of Major General, is set out from hence, by his Majesty's Order, for Silesia.

Hague, Aug. 22. As the States of this Province are to assemble towards the Beginning of next Month, 'tis thought her Royal Highness the Princess Governante will quit Dieren about that Time, and return to the House in the Wood.

Brussels, Aug. 27. A few Days ago Lieutenant Colonel Walthers, of the Regiment of Artillery, an Officer much esteemed, and who had the chief Direction of the Foundery at Mechlin, received Orders to repair immediately to Bohemia; and we are informed he is to set out this Day, with some other Officers belonging to the Train. Last Wednesday, being the Festival of St. Louis, M. de Lessaps, the French Minister here, celebrated the same, by giving a great Entertainment; at which were present, his Royal Highness Prince Charles, and the chief Persons in the Administration of this Government.
