Lisbon, July 29.

LAST Thursday their Majesties and the Royal Family left their Tents, and went to reside in the new Palace built of Wood near Belem; upon which Occasion they received the Compliments of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers.

Milan, Aug. 16. On Thursday last Count Christiani, Great Chancellor of this Dutchy, set out from hence, by Order of the Empress-Queen, for Vienna, to assist at the Councils that are frequently held there on Affairs of Importance.

Copenhagen, Aug. 21. The King has caused an Ordinance to be published, forbidding the Exportation of Corn out of this Kingdom till the End of December next. Count Aschberg having obtained Leave to quit the Service, his Regiment is given to Major General Hauch, first Aid de Camp to his Majesty.

Vienna, Aug. 21. Yesterday Morning three Battalions and two Companies of Grenadiers of the Regiment of Marshal Leopold Daun marched from hence for the Camp of Ollischau in Moravia; and To-morrow or next Day the Regiment of Molck will pass by this City for the Camp near Colin in Bohemia. Ali Effendi, Envoy Extraordinary from the Bey of Tripoli to this Court, is daily expected here, and Apartments are getting ready, by their Imperial Majesties Order, for his Reception.

Vienna, Aug. 23. It is said the four Regiments of Horse, which have been encamped for some Time past at Kitsee, have received Orders to march into Bohemia and Moravia. The Emperor went to Hollitsch on Friday last, and the Empress followed his Majesty next Day to that Place, where she proposes to stay until the 4th of September; but the Emperor will remain there a Week or ten Days longer. The Vice-Chancellor Count Colorado went to his Country House at Zierendorff, on Friday last, and will not return to Town until about the Time that the Emperor comes back to Schonbrun. It is said Count Kaunitz will likewise take the Opportunity of the Absence of the Court to go to Austerlitz for a few Days.

Berlin, Aug. 24. The King has disposed of the Regiment of Dragoons, lately commanded

by Lieutenant General de Rutz, in Favour of M. Plettenberg, Colonel Commandant of the Regiment of Cuirassiers of Driesen, whom his Majesty has also promoted to the Rank of Major General.

Dresden, Aug. 29. Within these few Days past 300 Pieces of Ordnance have been sent from hence in Boats to Koenigstein. The Regiment of Cannoniers is marched into the Camp that is pitched between Pirna and Koenigstein. The other Saxon Regiments, as well as those that are in Garrison here, will march into the Camp on the 15th of September. Two Bridges of Boats are already laid over the Elbe, near the Camp, for the better Conveniency of the Army.

Hague, Aug. 31. The States of this Province will open their ordinary Assembly To-morrow. We are assured by an Express from Dieren, that her Royal Highness the Princess Governante will set out from thence, with the whole Court, either the latter End of this Week, or the Beginning of next, on her Return to the House in the Wood.
