HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Fourth of February laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein men-

tioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alto to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should vo-luntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Tenth Day of this Instant March : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seaman and Landman respectively, who shall, on or before the Twelfth Day of April next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January laft : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Twelfth Day of April next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Dresden, March 20. The Week before laft the Duke of Bevern marched out of Zittau with a Body of near 9000 Men, in order to deftroy the Dens the Auftrians keep upon their Frontiers. In which Expedition he took the Auftrian Magazine at Friedland in Bohemia, confifting of 9000 Sacks of Meal and great Store of Ammunition ; and, after making himfelf Mafter of Reichenberg, he returned to Zittau. The Van of his Troops, confifting of 150 Hullars of the Regiment of Putkammer, met a Body of 600 Croats, sustained by two Hundred Austrian Dragoons of Bathiani, at their entering Bohemia, and immediately fell upon them Sword in Hand, killed about Fifty of them, took Thirty Horfes; and made Ten Dragoons Prifoners. The Prufflans did not lofe one fingle Man on this Occafion, two of them only were flightly wounded, the Austrians having been immediately put to flight.

Bruffels, March 18. The French Troops intended for the Army on the Lower Rhine, are in Motion every where ; and this Evening the first Division from Lille is to be at Ghent. We have Advice from Paris, that Marechal de Belle Is is very much out of Order. Private Letters from Breft mention, that the Fleet; which had just failed from thence, was obliged to put back again on the 6th Instant ; the Formidable of 84 Guns, on Board of which was General Lally; having run foul of another Ship, by which both were much damaged, the Formidable, in particular, having loft her Masts. Bruffels, March 22. The Marquis de Ctil-

lon, Marechal de Camp, arrived here Yesterday with the First Division of the French Troops, confifting of two Battalions of the Regiment de la Marine ; and this Day they are to be replaced by two Squadrons of d'Aubigné's Dragoons. Some Alterations have been made with regard to the Corps of Auftrians which are to join the French. That Corps is now to confift of one Battalion of each of the four Walloon Regiments of Ligne, Los Rios, Saxe Gotha, and Arberg; to each of which have been added a Company of Grenadiers of 60 Men, draughted out of the Battalions that remain in the Netherlands. Thefe Troops are to be affembled at Ruremonde on the 31st Instant. The Letters from Paris confirm the Return of the French Fleet to Breft on the 6th Inftant, occafioned by a Hurricane, in which feveral of the Ships loft their Mafts.

Bruffels, March 25. The Prince de Soubife arrived here Yefterday, and alighted at the French Minister's. He purposes to proceed Tomorrow Morning for Stockem. The French Troops continue to march through this Place by two Battalions or two Squadrons a Day. Those that are already gone through, are the sour Battalions of La Marine, and the sour Squadrons of d'Aubigné's Dragoons. This Day the Regiment of Salis-Grislons, of two Battalions, is expected in Town. For the Conveniency of the French Troops passing through this Country; the

the Government here has publified a Placart, by which the fmall French Coins, fuch as Moulquetaires, Pieces of fix Liards, of fix Sols, of 12 Sols, and of 24 Sols, are allowed to be current in the Austrian Netherlands, provisionally, as they were during the lass War. The Letters from Paris mention the Arrival of the Marechal d'Estrées at Verfailles, on the 18th Instant. The Dolphin Packet Boat, Captain Cockrill, bound from Helvoet to Harwich, was taken and carried into Calais, the 20th Inftant, by a French Privateer Snow, of 14 Cuns and 130 Men, called the General Lally, Pierre Sauve, Commander, belonging to Boulogne. The Mail was thrown over-board. The Letters just arrived from France, tell us likewife, that the Hanover Packet Boat, bound from Falmouth to Lisbon, has been taken and carried into Breff oy the Comtesse de Bentheim Privateer belonging to St. Malo.
