A RROCLAMATION,

For the better Supply of Mariners and Seamen to ferve on Board Merchant Ships, and other Trading Ships, and Privateers.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS by an A& of Parliament passed in the Thirteenth Year of Our Reign, intituled, An Act for the better Supply of Mariners and Seamen to ferve in His Majefty's Ships of War, and on Board Merchant Ships, and other trad-ing Ships, and Privateers, We are authorized and enabled, when War is declared against any foreign Power, to publish Our Royal Proclama-tion, if We should judge it requisite, to permit all Merchant Ships, and other trading Vef fels, and Privateers, to be manned with Foreign Mariners and Seamen, during fuch War, in the Manner as by the faid AA is provided .- And whereas War hath been declared against the French King, but the iffuing of fuch Proclamation hath been hitherto rendered unneceffary, by Reafon of an Act paffed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, An AA for the better Supply of Mariners and Seamen to ferve in His Majefty's Ships of War, and on Board Merchant Ships, and other trading Ships and Veffels; the Provisions of which last mentioned Act are near expiring-We do therefore now judge it neceffary to permit, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby permitting and allowing, that during the Continuance of this prefent War, and no longer (except in Respect to such Merchant Ships, and other trading Ships or Veffels, and Privateers, which shall be on their Voyage, before the Determination of the War, who shall be, and are hereby allowed the Liberty and Benefit of returning home navigated in the Manner as is herein after provided) it shall be lawful for any Merchant Ship, or other Trading Ship or Veffel, or Privateer, to be navigated by Foreign Seamen or Mariners, not being Natives of Great Britain, or of any of the Colonies or Plantations thereto belonging, or Our natural, or naturalized Subjects, fo as the Number of fuch Foreign Seamen or Mariners do not exceed three Fourths of the Mariners at any one Time employed to navigate fuch Merchant Ship, or other Trading Ship or Vefiel, or Pri-vateer; and that one Fourth at least of the Mariners or Seamen fo employed, be at all Times Natives, or Our naturalized Subjects of Great Britain, (fudden Death, and a Hazard and Cafualties of War and the Seas, faved and excepted) one Act of Parliament made in the twelfth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty

King Charles the Second, intituled, An Act for the Encouraging and Increasing of Shipping and Navigation, or any other Statute or Law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-fifth Day of March 1757, in the Thirtieth Year of Our Reign. GOD Save the KING.

An AEt to amend an AET, made in the Twenty Ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Maje/fy, initialed, An AET to render more effectual an AET paffed in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George, to prevent unlawful Combinations of Workmen employed in the Woollen ManufaEtures, and for better Payment of their Wages; and alfo an AET, paffed in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His faid late Majefty, for the better Regulation of the Woollen ManufaEture, and for preventing Difputes among the Perfons concerned therein, and for limiting a Time for profecuting for the Forfeiture appointed by the aforefaid AET, in Cafe of Payment of the Workmen's Wages in any other Manner than in Money.

An Act for making the River Blyth navigable, from Halefworth Bridge, in the County of Suffolk, into the Haven of Southwould.

An Act for the ascertaining and collecting the Poor's Rates, and for the better ordering and regulating the Poor, in the Parillo of Scint Luke, in the County of Middlefex.

Windfor, March 30. Efferday the Duke of Devorthire, and the LE Earls of Carlifle, Northumberland, and Hertford, were installed Knights Companions of the most Noble Order of the Garter, in the Chapel of St. George, with the accustomed Solemnities, by the Dukes of Machborough and Kingston, two of the Commissioners appointed by the Sovereign for that Purpose. A Procession was afterwards made to the Upper Cafile, where a noble Entertainment was provided in the Great Guard Chamber; and, at the fecond Courfe, the Stiles of the new Knights were proclaimed by Garter King of Arms as usual. There was The Night likewife a Table for the Ladies. concluded with a Ball and Supper, at which were present, several Foreign Ministers, and a great Number of the Nobility and Perfons of Diffinction of both Sexes ; the whole being conducted with as much Order and Splendour as ever known upon the like Occafion.

Hambourg, March 16. M. Anckelmann, a Member of this Magistracy, who died here the Week before laft, in an advanced Age, has been fucceeded by M. Paulson, a confiderable Merchant of this City. M. d'Affeburg, the Danish Envoy at the Court of Sweden, arrived here a few Days ago, and fet out laft Sunday on his Way to Copenhagen.

Drefden, March 23. All the Soldiers in this Town, and its Suburbs, are kept in Readiness to march on the first Notice. Yefterday about 400 Bakers, who were hired in different Parts of the Empire, to bake Bread for the Prussian Army, arrived here. The Night between the 16th and 17th Infant, ten large Cannon were fent from hence towards Freyberg, efcorted by a Detachment of the Regiment of Prince Maurice of Anhalt. Ori Monday last the Prussian Soldiers, at the Request of the Magistrates, took up all labouring Men and Servants they could find in the Streets, in order to compleat the Number of Recruits this City was obliged to furnish his Prussian Majesty; but next Morning all those that were found to be in the Service of her Majefty the Queen of Poland, of the Electoral Prince, and the Princes his Brothers, and those of some of the Nobility, were fet at Liberty. Bruffels, March 29. The French Troops

that have paffed through this Place fince laft Friday, are the Regiments of Salis-Grisons, Conty, Poitou, and La Couronne, each of two Batallions ; Aquitaine is expected this Day. Several French General Officers have likewife passed through Brussels for the Army fince last Friday, without stopping ; particularly the Comte de Maillebois, Comte de Lorges, and Comte St. Germain. The Prince de Soubize proceeded from hence for Stockem on Saturday Morning. The French Squadron, under the Command of M. d'Apcher, was still at Bress on the 16th Infant.

Whitehall, April 2.

The Restitution of the Duc de Penthievre Prize, taken by the Antigallican Privateer, and carried into Cadiz, having been demanded of the Court of Spain by the French, we hear that the faid Ship, in Confequence of Orders of the Court of Madrid, remains a Deposit in the Hands of Spain, the Hatches being sealed up, and under a Spanish Guard, in order to prevent all Embezzlement, until the Grounds of the faid French Pretension can be examined and judged.

The King has been pleafed to order a Congé d'Elire to país the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Metropolitical Church of Canterbury to elect an Archbishop of that See, the fame being void by the Death of the most Reverend Father in God Dr. Thomas Herring, late Archbishop thereof : And also to order a Letter, under His Royal Sign Manual, naming and recommending to the faid Dean and Chapter, the most Reverend Father in God Dr. Mathew Hutton, Archbishop of York, to be by them elected to the faid See of Canterbury.
