A RROCLAMATION,

For the better Supply of Mariners and Seamen to ferve on Board Merchant Ships, and other Trading Ships, and Privateers.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed in the Thirteenth Year of Our Reign, intituled, An Act for the better Supply of Mariners and

Seamen to ferve in His Majefty's Ships of War, and on Board Merchant Ships, and other trading Ships, and Privateers, We are authorized and enabled, when War is declared against any foreign Power, to publish Our Royal Proclamation, if We should judge it requisite, to permit all Merchant Ships, and other trading Veffels, and Privateers, to be manned with Foreign Mariners and Seamen, during fuch War, in the Manner as by the faid Act is provided .- And whereas War hath been declared against the French King, but the iffuing of fuch Proclamation hath been hitherto rendered unneceffary, by Reafon of an Act paffed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled, An Act for the better Supply of Mariners and Seamen to ferve in His Majefty's Ships of War, and on Board Merchant Ships, and other trading Ships and Veffels; the Provisions of which last mentioned Act are near expiring-We do therefore now judge it neceffary to permit, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, iffue this Our Royal Pro clamation, hereby permitting and allowing, that during the Continuance of this prefent War, and no longer (except in Respect to fuch Merchant Ships, and other trading Ships or Vessels, and Privateers, which shall be on their Voyage, before the Determination of the War, who fhall be, and are hereby allowed the Liberty and Benefit of returning home navigated in the Manner as is herein after provided) it shall be lawful for any Merchant Ship, or other Trading Ship or Veffel, or Privateer, to be navigated by Foreign Seamen or Mariners, not being Natives of Great Britain, or of any of the Colonies or Plantations thereto belonging, or Our natural, or naturalized Subjects, fo as the Number of fuch Foreign Seamen or Mariners do not exceed three Fourths of the Mariners at any one Time employed to navigate fuch Merchant Ship, or other Trading Ship or Veffel, or Pri-vateer; and that one Fourth at least of the Mariners or Seamen fo employed, be at all Times Natives, or Our naturalized Subjects of Great Britain, (sudden Death, and a Hazard and Cifualties of War and the Seas, faved and

excepted) one Act of Parliament made in the twelfth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King Charles the Second, intituled, An Act for the Encouraging and Increasing of Shipping and Navigation, or any other Statute or Law to the contrary notwithftanding.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-fifth Day of March 1757, in the Thirtieth Year of Our Reign.

GOD Save the KING.

AT the Court at St. James's the 9th Day of April, 1757,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the First of March last, For paying the respective Bounties therein menti-

oned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alto to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of this Inftant April : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seaman and Landman respectively, who shall, on or before the Twelsth Day of May next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last : And likewise, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid Twelfth Day of May next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who fhall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
