P R E S E N T,
The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Ninth of April last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewise for paying the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, is near expiring: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to such Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Thirteenth Day of June next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last: And likewise, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Persons who shall, on or before the said Thirteenth Day of June next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Venice, May 6. On Sunday last Sig. Sebastian Foscarini was appointed Ambassador from this Republick to the King of Spain. Yesterday Cavalier Ruzzini set out for Vienna, with the Character of Ambassador to their Imperial Majesties, in the room of Sig. Cozzer, who is going Ambassador to the Pope, the Cavalier Capello, our late Ambassador at that Court, being on his Return Home.

Brussels, May 17. There are Letters in Town from Paris; which affirm positively, that the Fleet, commanded by M. Du Bois de la Mothe, consisting of nine Ships of the Line, and five Frigates, sailed from Brest on the 3d Instant for Canada, with 4 or 5000 Men on Board. They likewise say, that the Fleet, intended for the East Indies, under M. d'Apcher, consisting of 17 Sail, (including the Company's Ships) with 3000 Men on Board, sailed the same Day from l'Orient. Comte de la Marche went thro' this Place, incognito, on Saturday Evening, as did likewise Yesterday the Prince de Condé.

Brussels, May 20. We received on Wednesday from Vienna, a Confirmation of the Defeat of the Austrian Army at Auwal near Prague, on the 6th Instant; but as yet the Particulars are not known. The Duke of Orleans went through this Place on Wednesday Morning, in the greatest Haste, in order to join the Army under Marshal d'Estrees.

His Majesty having been graciously pleased, by his Warrant under his Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th of June, 1733, to establish certain Rules and Orders for the Relief of Poor Widows of Commission and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy: These are to give Notice, that Copies of the said Rules and Orders are lodged with the Commissioners of his Majesty's Navy at Chatham, Portsmouth, and Plymouth; as also with the Clerks of the Cheque at Deptford, Woolwich, and Sheerness; and with the Naval Officers at Harwich, Deal, and Kinsale; where all such Widows as intend to lay in their Claims, may be informed of all Particulars which entitle them to the Benefit of the said Charity, and receive the proper Certificates for that Purpose. And the Governors of the said Charity intending to distribute to the Widows of Sea Officers who died before the 30th of August 1732, as well as to the Widows of those who died since that Time, whose Circumstances come within the Rules of the Establishment, such Monies as may be due to them on the 31st of May Instant; This is to give Notice thereof, that any Widows who have not yet applied, and intend to lay in their Claims, may do so as soon as possible; and that all such Widows whose Claims have been already allowed, may send or bring to this Office, by the 31st of this Instant, the Affidavits required by the Rules, in order to their being continued upon the Pension or Bounty.
