This Analysis (which respects not the Generation of Quantities but their Properties) is, in Geometrical and Physical Enquiries, not less, if not more, useful than the best Method of Computation hitherto published; and, being founded on the proper Principles of Algebra, without borrowing any foreign one from the Doctrine of Motion, or considering Quantities as composed of infinitely small Particles, is, it is presumed, more perspicuous than either Sir Isaac Newton's Method of Fluxions or Mr. Leibnitz's Differential Calculus.
