

**Hague, Oct. 18.** The Campaign on the Side of Magdebourg seems to be finished, at least the French publicly declare their Intentions of going into Winter Quarters as soon as possible, not finding it practicable to undertake any Thing further against his Prussian Majesty, with the least Appearance of Success, in this advanced Season. The Opposition Marshal Richelieu has found on that Side, and the Nearness of Wolfenbuttle to Magdebourg, has made him resolve to fix his Head Quarters at Hanover, rather than Brunswick, as the latter is more exposed to be insulted. The Letters from the French Army are filled with Apprehensions of a Winter Campaign, which they say the King of Prussia is preparing for, and which highly disgusts the French, whose Troops are diminished at least one Half since the Beginning of the Campaign.
