Rome, Nov. 26. The Pope has come to a Refolution to abolish the Farm of the Tobacco at the End of the prefent Year.

Florence, Dec. 3. On the 28th paft His Britannick Majeffy's Ship the Guernfey anchored at Leghorn from a Cruize.

Hamburgh, Dec. 16. By repeated Accounts from Silefia, the Advantage gained there by his Pruffian Majefty over the Auftrians proves ftill more confiderable than was at first imagined. General Zieten, with the greatest Part of the Pruffian Cavalry, purfued the Auftrians the two following Days, and it is affured, that the Number of Prisoners made in the Action, and those two Days, amount to above 17000.

By Letters received To-Day, Prince Ferdinand of Brunfwick's Head Quarters were at Altenhagen near Zell. The French have fet Fire to the Suburbs of Zell. It was doubtful whether they intended to defend or evacuate the Town. The French Army is posted behind Zell. The Castle of Harbourg has not yet furrendered.

Hague, Dec. 20. By all Accounts, the Victory gained on the 5th Inftant by the Pruffians, is the most compleat that has been ever gained. A full Detail of the Battle, and of its Confequences, are expected every Day.

His Pruffian Majefty is faid to have fummoned the Town of Breflau the 7th Inftant, in which the Auftrians have left General Spreeher with about Twelve Thousand Men; who answered, That he was ready to give up the Town, if the King would let him march out freely with his

Garrifon : But that the King of Profile replied, That as the Governor knew the Terms granted at Schweidnitz by General Nadaft, he might draw up a Capitulation in the fame Form, and fend it to him, and he would agree to it. The Event of this Negociation is not yet come to our Knowledge.

We have no Particulars from the Army under Prince Ferdinand of Brunfwick, except that his Highnels arrived at Altenhagen near Zell on the 13th Inftant : That the French had burnt the Bridge over the Aller, fet Fire to the Suburbs, and had abandoned the Town the 14th or 15th, and retired towards Hanover. Prince Ferdinand having reprefented to Marshal Richelieu the Confequences of fuch a Proceeding, the Marshal alledged that it was done by mere Accident.
