• HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Ninth of November last, For paying the respective Bounties there-

in mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy ; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons discovering Seamen who should conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Fourteenth Day of this Inftant January : And whereas it is judged expedient for His'Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Twenty-eighth Day of February next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Extract of a Letter from Capt. Elliot, of His Majesty's Ship the Hussar, to Mr. Clevland,

dated at Kinfale the 11th of January 1758. Upon the 8th, in Latitude of 49 and a half, and about 45 Leagues to the Westward of the Lizard, I faw a French Privateer at Day-break within about two or three Gun-fhot : I chaced him till Three in the Evening before I could come up with him, when he brought too, and we engaged for an Hour and three Quarters before he struck, with eight Feet Water in his Hold, five Guns difmounted, 52 Men killed, 37 wounded, Main and Mizen Mafts gone, and the Foremast fo much damaged, that it went away the next Morning. She is called the Vengeance belonging to St. Malo's, is pierced for 32 Guns, but has mounted only 24 Twelve and Nine Pounders, about 20 Swi-

l'Equipage.

I had fix Men killed, and 15 wounded; the Lieutenant of Marines is the only Officer 1 have wounded. I have the Pleafure to acquaint their Lordships, that the Officers and Seamen. under my Command, behaved with the greatest Bravery.

Whereas on Tuesday the 8th Instant; in the Night, John Miles and William Dodd, Officers of the Customs, belonging to the Port of Arundell in Suffex, with four Dragoons, fell in with a large Gang of Smuglers, to the Number of Fifty or upwards, who were loading a great Number of Horfes with Tea, and upon the Officers attempting to Jeize the fame, a Signal was given by the Smuglers to a Cutter lying near the Shore, belonging to Selfey near Chichester, commanded by one Ibomas Green, as reprefented by the Account transmitted to the Commissioners of His Majess's Customs, from which Cutter the faid Tea was brought and landed, as there is great Reason to believe; And whereas thereupon a great Quantity of Fire Arms and other offensive Wea-pons were brought from the Cutter to the Smughers on the Shore, with which they (the Smuglers) fired uron the Officers and Dragoons, and that one Thomas Cole, a Dragoon of the Inificiling Regiment, commanded by the Honourable Licutenant General Cholmondley, who is fince dead, and alfo dangeroufly wounded another Dra-goon, and wiolently beat and abufed one of the Officers of the Cuftoms, and refcued from the Officers much the greatest Part of the faid Tea. The Commillioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the Offenders to Justice, and the more effectually to put a Stop to fuch illegal, wielent, and outragious Proceedings, do bereby promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Perfon or Perfons who shall apprehend the faid Offenders, or any or either of them, fo that they may be dealt with according to Law, to be paid by the Receiver General of His Majesty's Customs, on Conviction of each of the faid Offenders.
