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Cbefter, March 3 I.

WEare now certainly informed of the Maty Yachr being call awiay, as the was coming from Irelend, by two perfons that efaped from on boatd her, who relate thefe particulars; Thar the 25 inflant about two a clock in the morsing, the weather being veny foggy, the Yache touched upon a Rock, to the N.W. of the sherties, a fmathile to the Eaftward of Holybead Bity, the Seameri and Paffengers being moft of them fnug under Deck; the friftouch rouzed the Seamen, who looking about, eryedy All is well; but prefently after the Yiche Aruck again or another Rock, and there ftuck, fo trear the Skerrtes, that when the Sea made the Veffel rowl, the Malt toughed the Land, by which only means, thole that were prêferved, efcaped: The Earl of Meath, anid aboũt 34 more perifled in the Yaclit, of which number were the Captain, whofe name was Burftom, the Boatfwain, and two ordinary Seamen; the Mafter, 23 Mariners, and $i \$$. Paffingers, got upon the lile, and fo were faved; among thele Is Paffengers were the Eatl of Arglofs, anid the Lord Ardee, Son and Heir to the Earl of Mcath: That about noon, on the faid 25 , the Maft gave way; that the Captain endeavouring to fave the Earl of Menth, and the reft; loft himelf. That thofe that were preferved, were on the llle, which is about a League from hore, from Thurfay morning, till Saturday afternoon. That with a Steel andalittle Gunpowder, they ftruck fire, and made a fire of the wreckt boards of the yackt, by which they rofted fome Mutron, they found on the Ine, which is uninhabited, but had no Bread, nor any liquor, but falt Water, till Phovidence cill afhoar a Runlet of Ulquebaugh, which they divided among them; that at laft a fmall Veffel of Bcwomorris, came and fetched them offy and landed therin on Sunday morning at Bemmorios. This is the moft particular aceount wè have of this fad accident.

Lime, March 3 .. The 29 inflant arrived hete the Arms of this place, from St. Malo's, the Mafter tells us, that thete is great Fleet already gone from that and ochier ports, for Newofoundland, and that more will follow, fo that the French willecmploy in that Fifhing this year, above. 50 fail, many of them Ships of great bithen, and mounced with 16,18 , and 20 Gurs.
Milan, Afarch 2o. We cannot quit the apprehenfions we are in of the Duke of savoy's intentions againlt this Country, nor the belief we bave of his being entred into afrait engagement with-moft the Chriftian King againat the Kpaniands; though no publick figns appear thereof 29 yet: However to be provided againfl the wortt, our Govertort cie Prince de Ligne has fent dives Ingeniers and other fit perfons to pifit our feveral Frontier places on that, ade, that upon their teport of the prefent fate of then, his Execllency may give fuch orders as are necoffary. Levies are fitl making here for the Service of Sicily, from whence his excellenty has lately recpived Iectors, which prefs the difpatching frem hence ald the hantance poflible, andwithout any delay;

Venice, March 23. Our Letters from Confantinolto of the 17 February, tell us, of the great preparations, that are making at Adrianople for the celebrating the Ceremony of the Circumcifing the Suitans eldef Son, and the the marrying his daughter to one of hisFavorites, That there feemed a great difpofition for the making a Peace with the Crown of Föand, which the genersy o pinion is will be concluded beforctie featon be fit tor the Armies to take the Field. Yefterday in the evening parted from hence rowards Zante the General Priul, We are told that the Sénate harh refufed to grant paffage through the Gulf to certain Spanifh Troops defigned to have been embarked at Triefte, and themes waniported for saily, to be employed againl Meflinà. Yciterday the Secretary of the Embafy of Franee, had Audience of the Senate, to acquaine them that the molt Chrit ftainn King had accepred of the Mediation of this State.

Marfcilles, April 3. This day we ricfived advice of the arrival of Monfieur Ducaneat Thoslon with fire Men of War from Megint, and that he brings in act count of the farther fucceffes of the French in thofe parts, viz. That they had taken the Scaletta, Cataqu; and Me' 2 io, being Ponts of yery great importance, but adds, that the ARe filze fes begun to be again in fome want of Provifions; The Gallies and Men of War that that are fitting hereandat Thoulon; will therefore be haflened with alf the diligence poffible, the firft are reidy to fill, andexpect only a fair wind.
Vienna, March 24 . On Monday laft the Count of Wal đick parted herce on his return for Holland, very well fatisfied with the fuccefs he has had in the feveral Marters he came to negotiate in this Court. On Thurfag laft arrived here the Marquis of Bongomineri, being difpatchea by the Duke de Vilia Ficrmofa, Govennoi of the $S_{p a r i z f}$ Netherlands; to give, as we are told his Imperial Majefly a particular acceunt of the prefent pofture of things in thofe Councreys, and to pray hint to haften his Army into the Field. The Councide Mon tecuculh has already received a very great fum of Money; and this week he is to yeceive 60000 Crowns more, The 4 of the next month, it is certainly faid, his Excellency: will fet forward towards the Army, with whith he wilf act apart, and feparately: the Duke of Loriain will like-, wife have a Body of an Army compoled of his Gwni, and fome other Troops; which he will Command abrolutely; and the Forces of the Elector of Ardedenburg, wills irs Faid, joyn with the Imperialifs in Silchia, which are already about 10000 flrong, to oppofe the Swedes.

Ratisbonne, March 28: Yeflerday the States of the Empire being affembled, a Memurial was prefented to them on the part of the Prince. of Baden Dourlach General of the Troops of the 10 Circles, by which he makes inftance, that he faid Circles may becerorted to caufe the Troops, allotted for their feveral proportions: which are to be this Campagne double of what they were: the laft, to match with all diligence, roprevent the Ruines and Devaltations which may be otherwife made by the Ehemy, if there be no body tu oppofe them: and at the fame dine whs commuticated to the Dy is the agrecmentmade as Whate, betwen the Deputies ot
