U.R. Letters from Poland do not confirm the death of Dorofensko, the news of which had been received with great joy, for the advan-tage it would have been to the Crown 5 it being not to be doubted, but the Rebel Cof-Jacks would, after the death of their Captain, have fub-

Some Letters fay, mitted themfelves to his Majefty. That Dorofensko had indeed, being in drink, had a fall from his Horfe, fo that he lay for feveral hours fpeechlefs, which occasioned the report of his being dead, but that he is very well recovered of ir. The Treaty of Accommodation between him and his Majefty does not advance verymuch, for though it is thought that Dorofensko is of himfelf fufficiently disposed to it ; yet it feems the fear of offending the Turks, in whole hands are his wife and children as Hoftages, makes him very backward of coming to any conclution. We have advice, That an Amballador is arrived at Leopel from the Czar of Mofcovy, and that he comes to propole a Conjunction of Arms against the Turks ; which the Poles will give no great regard to, seeing the actions of the Moscouires this last Summer, did not in any manner correspond with the obligation of the Treaty they had with his Majefty. The Suedes have fill their quarters in the Hinder Pomeren, but the feation coming on, we expect they will ere long begin to move.

Naples, March 24. We do not yet hear that the French have poffeffed themfelves of the Scaletta, though the Spaniards finding themfelves so beset on all sides, tha they cannot be able to maintain it, are preparing to leave it, and have already begun to withdraw part ef their Artillery. It is faid here, that the Meffinef s begin again to have great want of Provisions, and that for that reason the Duke de Vivonne has sent an Express to Marseilles and Thoulon, to halten the farther supplies expected from thence. Our Viceroy is fending several Troops into Sicily, having for their transportation hired feven Tartanes.

Vienna, March 29. Some days fince arrived here à Deputy from the City of Strasburgh, to reprefent, as is faid, the danger it is in from the French, becaufe of its retuling the Neutrality proposed by them, and to pray his Imperial Majesty will be pleased to fend tome Troops for their allilance and fecurity; which does not agree, with the news we have from other hands, viz. That the Magilirates of Strasburgh have concluded a Treaty of Neutrality with the French Envoy, and that they are to have a Garifon of Sulfers to enable them to maintain it. Great quantities of Corn are buying up in Moravia, and or her the Emperors Hereditary Countries, for the ule of the Armies this Summer. The Count de Montecuculi will now begin his journey in few days ; it is conflidently faid, that he will first pais to Munick, to confet with the Elector of Bavaria, and from thence proeced to Cologne. We have news of the death of Gene-. ral spork in Bohemia, and that the Emperor has given' his Command to Prince Chatles of Lorrain.

nally to refolve about the march of the Troops which they are to furhish for their Quota. The Marquels of Baden Dourlach, General of the Forces of the Empire, makes great instances at the Dyet at Ratabon, that their march may be haftened for the fecurity of the Empire. The Elector Palatine fince the feizing of Germshas alfo put Garifons into Steynack and Hirfchorne, likewife belonging to the Elector of Mayence, to prevent their falling into the hands of the French. It is faid, That the Emperor, and the other Princes of the Empire his Allies, use great endeavors at the Dyer, to have the Suedes declared Enemies of the Empire, in cife they do not quit the Territories of the Elector of Brundenburgh. and make reparation for all the damages his Subjects have fuffered by the Suedif Troops. Some here pretend to have news from Vienni, that the Count de Monrecuculi was parted from thence, towards the Elector of Bavaria's Court, with intention to remain there fome few days only, and then to continue his way towards the Army. The death of General Sporke is confirmed, and that his Command in the Army is given to the Prince of Lorrain.

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Brifac, April S. The Imperial Troops that were lodged in Suabia, are to the number of 4000, come towards the Rhine; it is believed that their intentions were to have passed'it, and to have entred into Alfatia : upon which, the Maiquels de Vaubrun our Governor, sent out a Party of Horle under the Command of the Sieur le Roy to take an account of them ; who returning, brought word, that the faid Imperial Troops were feparated, and had put chemfelves into the four Forest Cities (as they are called.) The Suiffe Canton have written to the Emperor, and his Molt Chriftian Majeffy, concerning the Neutrality formerly proposed between Alfaria, and the Countrey of Brijgow, which they leem to delire very earnefily; and in the mean time they have prayed the Marquels de Vaubram to grant a Sufpension of Arms, till fuch time as the Emperors, and the Moft Chriftian Kings minds be known in the matter ; to which the Marquels answered, that he could not do any thing without

the King's particulat ofder. Cologne, April 4. On Tuefday laft, the Prince of Lorrain parted from Bon for Aix la Chapelle, having before isfued orders for the march of feveral Troops towards Luxemburgh, to act under the orders of Monfieur de Louvigny, who at prefent commands in that Province. The defign of the Princes going to Aix, is faid to be, that being to much hearer to Liege, he may be the betier able to fee what can be done towards the removing the French out of that Cittadel, in which there feems but little appearance of fuccels ; the general opinion being, that the Inhabitants of Liege, notwithilanding the contern they expressed at firit, are very well pleafed that they are under the French protection ; and that many of the principal of them, had knowledge of the delign before it was put into execution.
