HEREAS Information bath been this Day given to His Majesty at this Board, that the English Privateers, cruizing in the Mediterranean, visit many Neutral Ships bound from the Levant, and Smyrna, where the Plague now rages; -And it being of the utmost Importance to prevent the Infection being brought into this Kingdom by any of the faid Privateers, - His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, and Command, that all Privateers, and all Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes, on Board the same, now arrived, or that shall hereaster arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from the Mediterranean, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, and do likewise strictly conform themselves, in all Respects, to the Rules and Regulations required to be observed by Ships and Veffels coming from Smyrna, and other Parts of the Levant, and the Coast of Barbary. -And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors, or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the taid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necesfary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
