Genohi, March19. By 2 Veffel arrived here from Naples we have adrice, that the Spanifh Armada, which had been engaged againtt the Doke de Vivonac, being refitted, was gone to Sea again, and had taken their courfe towards Mefsina; with a refolution to hinder the entranee of the further fuccors that are expected from Erazte; and the rather, for that it is certainly faid, chat Provifions begin to grow ajain very farce in Mefsi$\boldsymbol{n a}_{\text {, }}$ and that without a fuddain fupply, thofe Inhabitants will be brought to great extreminies ; and fome Letters add, as if they were grealy afficted with the Plague, which may its thought, have been partly occtfioned by their ill Dyer. By the laft Orfinary ftom Spain, certain Merchants heie received, as we are told, Bills of Exchange for 100000 Crowns, to be remitted to the Viceroy of sicity. Don fuan is fuddaimly expected in Italy, and from his Prefence the Spaniards. hope much.

- Milan, Marib 20. The 15 inftant embatked at Final, 8 Troops of difmounted Cavalry, and the fame day to. wards evening fet fail for sicily, the 500 German Foot which parted from hence fume time fince, and which our Governor was in fome painfor, becaufe of a report of their having beencalt away, are arived at Gaetia, intending to proceed from thence with the firlt fair wind; Several of the Men of War and Gallies which the Freach fited out at Tl.oulon and Mar Jeilles, for the affilting the $A \operatorname{cfinefes}$, are come to Monaco, where they in few days, expect the reft of their compixny.

Copenibagen, Aprii8. On Thurdaylat our Queen was happily brought to Bed of a young Priace, who the next day was Chriftead by the name of Chriftianus, to the great joy of this Court. We du not yet certainly know how far his Majefty will ingage himfelf in favor of the Confederates, though we underfand, that Whey are very confident of the difpofition of this Court in their behalf. Vieuna, April x. The Count de Montecuculi contie nues his refolution of parting from hence the 40 of 5 inftant at fartheft, and will be accompanied with two Lords of the Emperors Council, who are upon all occafions to affilt his Excellency with theit advice. The Emperor has appointed the Colonel Mafchart; to ge to Tirol, to fee that things be put in a polture of ide: fence on that fide. The latt Letters from Gencral Gops; who Commandsithe Imperial Troops in Silefors gave an account that the Swedes continue in their quarcers without committing any hoftilities, but that he belies ved they will nog remain much longer in, that pgfure, The 15 of the next month, the Brandenburg Troops will quit their Winter quagrters, which they have had in the Circle of Franconia, to the great vexation of thofe Inhabitants, and march towards the Electors own Territories, to oppofe the Swedes.

Strasburg, April 8. The 3 infant 400 Men of the Circle of saxony, who had their quarters in wilfiadt, upder the Command of Licurenant-Colonel Roltaulerst arrived here for the guard of our Fort on the Rhyne: and to morrow we expea here 800 Men more of the Troops of the fame Circle, fo that we thall be then pretty well fecure, and yet more; when the Ttoops promifed by the Swifers are Jikewife here. The 4000 Imperialits which came from suabia, under the Conduct of Ma-jor-Gencralschuiz had fome great deligne in hand, but it mifluckr, for that the Binhop of Bafle refufed paffage through his Territories. The French have removed the Magazine they had made at colmar to Haguexam, where it will be more fafe. The French of Philips. buyg do greatly infelt the Palatinate with their incurgons, and have lately burnt feveral Villages more. Io. morrow the old Duke of Lerrain parts from bence to wards his Troops, with which it is faid, he is to act apart this Campagne. The French Envoye, Monfieur d' Ablancour, feems intended to remain here all this. Summer.

Cologne, Aprili2. Greatelt part of the Imperial Troops, that were quartered on this fide the Rbyne, are on their march; on Mondaynext they will pafs the River at Bonne, and being joyned with the Troops on the ocher fide, take their way towards Gobients; It is faid they defigne to goand attack Treves, but the generat opinion is, that they will march cowards Francfort, to meet their General the Count do Montecuculi, who will bring about 10000 Men with him. We are told, that the Coni: federates will have this Campagne, five Armies in the field; the one confifting of the Imiperial Troops; will be Commanded by the Count de Montecucuti, whish is to a iet in Alfatia and on the Rhyne ; the fecond, to act under the Conduct of the Duke of Lortain, between the Mcufe and the Mefette, and to ferve as a fying Army ; the third, to oppofe the Swedes, and to he Comtmanded by the Elector of Brandenburg, and compofed of his and the Imperial Troops at prefent in silefia; the fourth, is to be made up of the Lunenburg Troops, and tholf furnifhed by the Bithop of ofnatrug, and the Biflop of Maugfer; the firft being; as is faid, to fend 16000 the fecond 6000 , and the laft 10006 Men ; and the fifth Army, is to be Commanded by the Prince of Orange in Flanders; befides which, we reckoh the King of Denmark will ait with 16000 Men, fo that we are in great expectation here of doing confiderable Matters rhis Campanne. The intended Equipage for the Editick, is wholly laid afide, that being, as is faids to be left to the King of Denmark; and the Stares have onely tefolved, to fet out 18 Men of War, to ferve for the guard ofour Coatts, againif the French Capers; which very much infell them.

Hague, April ib. We are here exreamly joyed to fee his Highnefs fo well recoprered of his illoets; This' day he changed tild Linnen for the firt time, fince the Small pos came out; To morrow he intends to appear ous of his Bedchamber, and by Friday next,' it is bo-
