That on the 16th Inflant, about Three o'Clock in the Afternoon, the Sloop Lady's Endeavour, William Moorey, Mafter, of Emsworth, Burthen about 35 Tons, laden with Grain, and bound from New Shoreham to Portsmouth, was drove ashore to the Eastward of the Pierhead at Newhaven, where she lies stranded, but most Part of the Cargo is saved, and not greatly damaged, and is secured in the King's Warehouse at Newhaven, together with the Ship's Sails.

Also, on the 15th Instant, the Dutch Galliot the Justicow Ulkiew, Scitse Fierds de Vries, Master, Burthen about 200 Tuns, laden with Sugar, Tobacco, Coffee, and Indigo, bound from Guernsey to Hamburgh, was drove ashore on the Rocks at Low Water at a Place called New Way, about two Miles to the Westward of Newhaven, and entirely dashed to Pieces, and the Crew, with great Difficulty, saved their Lives; about Forty Hogsheads of Tobacco and one small Cask of Indigo, is all that could be saved out of her.
