PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 15th of September last, for prohibiting the exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 29th Day of this Inftant April-And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome longer Time, -His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, that no Perfon or Persons whatsoever (except the Master General, Licutenant General, or principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this Instant April, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwile, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip, or lade, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf, first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His Majefty's Reign, entituled, "An A& to impower "His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of " Salt Petre, and to enforce the Law for em-** powering His Majesty to prohibit the Expor-" tation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " and Ammunition; and also to empower His * Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of " Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " or Ammunition,"-And the Lords Commif-fioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant General and principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majelty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceflary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. Copy of a Letter from the Honourable Captain Barrington, of His Majefty's Ship Achilles, of 60 Guns, to Mr. Clevland, dated at Falmouth, April 16, 1759.

I have the Pleafure to acquaint you of my Arrival here, with the Count de St. Florentin, of 60 Guns, and 403 Men from Cape François bound for Rochefort, commanded by the Sieur de Montay, whom I took on the 4th Inflant in Latitude 44. 15. fixty Leagues to the Weffward of Cape Finifter, after a close Engagement of two Hours, in which I was fo fortunate as only to have Two Men killed and Twenty-three wounded, with my Mafts, Sails and Rigging, much cut and damaged.

The Lofs on the Enemy's Side was very confiderable, having all his Mafts fhot away, with One hundred and fixteen Men killed and wounded, amongft the latter the Captain with a Mufquet Ball thto' his Body, of which he died two Days after.

I have fent Express to Sir Charles Hardy, defiring he would fend me Jury Masts for the Prize; and when the is fitted, will take the first Opportunity of carrying her to Plymouth.

I must beg you will acquaint their Lordships of the very gallant Behaviour of my Officers and People upon this Occasion.
