**O**N the 18th Instant sailed from Leghorn, a large Convoy of English Merchant Ships, escorted by His Britannick Majesty's Ships the Portland, Lime, and Glasgow.

The King has been pleased to order Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the Kingdom of Ireland, to constitute and appoint Henry Loftus, Henry Sandford, Henry Lyons, Thomas Adderly, Robert Cuninghame, John Magil and Carleton Whitelock, Esqrs. and the Survivors of them, or any three or more of them, Commissioners and Overseers of all Barracks for quartering His Majesty's Troops in the said Kingdom.

*Extract of a Letter from Captain Hughes, Commander of His Majesty's Frigate Tanager, to Mr. Cleveland; dated in Plymouth Sound, May the 1st, 1759.*

On Sunday the 30th of April, at Six o'Clock in the Morning, Portland bearing N. E. three Leagues, I saw two Sail coming round the Bill, and from their Appearance supposed them to be two French Privateers; I tacked and made Sail after them, and in a very short Time brought one of them too, which proved to be Le Chasseur Privateer from Dunkirk, of Six Carriage Guns, four of which they had thrown over board, and Forty-one Hands in all. I shifted the Prisoners as fast as possible, and then gave Chase to the other Sail, and at Seven o'Clock in the Evening brought her too, and found her to be Le Conquerant Privateer from Cherburg, mounting Six Carriage and Ten Swivel Guns, with Twenty-nine Hands in all. After having shifted the Prisoners, it blowing strong Easterly, I bore up for Plymouth, and got in safe to the Sound, with the two Privateers, the next Morning.

**M**Y Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having received many repeated Complaints of divers outrageous Acts of Piracy committed on Board great Numbers of Ships, as well English as Neutral, sailing in the English Channel, by the Crews of Ships or Vessels being or pretending to be English Privateers:

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Na-

tions in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, and to the great Dishonour thereof) are pleased to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst such Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any such Acts of Piracy as aforesaid, so as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of such Offences as aforesaid are greatly encouraged by divers Persons as Accessaries thereto, who knowingly assist, maintain, counsel, or advise the Committing of such Acts of Piracy, and also by Persons who receive Goods so piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed such Robberies:

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such last mentioned Offences, are pleased to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst such Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any such Offences last mentioned, so as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which said respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatsoever, by Samuel Seddon, Esq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of such Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the said Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any such Piratical Ships or Vessels) who shall discover any one or more of the said Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of such Offender or Offenders so discovered, be intitled to His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordships do also promise to grant, upon Request, to every Person, being a Seaman, (who by making any such Discovery or Discoveries, as aforesaid, shall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent his being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this present War with France.
