finé new Pilot Boat, of the Burthen of 20 Tons, or thereabout; Fifth Mast in the Partners, with four Iron Hoops on the same; an exceeding good Sailer, all Sails tanned of a good Colour. If the same shall happen to be retaken and brought into any Port of England, the Captors are desired to acquaint Mr. John Fosse, Collector of His Majesty's Customs of the said Port of Ilfordcombe, who will give all Satisfaction reasonably demanded for the same: N*B.* If the same Boat be fitted out as a Privateer from France, she may do great Damage to the Coasting Trade in these Channels.
