Camp upon the Rhine is to be in that Neighbourhood: Several others are marking out from

Rees up to Cologne.

The Allied Army about Munster is still in Cantonment, and that of Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick remains at Ziegenhayn. Detachment he has fent into Franconia will be at the Gates of Bamberg To-morrow, whilft Prince Henry has entered into that Country in three Columns.

The King of Prussia having attempted nothing farther on the Side of Moravia, fince General de la Ville's Retreat, his Majesty is returned

back to Landshut.

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Na tions in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, and to the great Dishonour thereof) are pleased to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst such Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any such Acts of Piracy as aforesaid, so as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted

And in regard the Committing of such Offences as aforesaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Accessaries thereto, who knowingly assist, maintain, councel, or advise the Committing of such Acts of Piracy, and also by Persons who receive Goods so piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect or bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such last mentioned Offences, are pleased to promise a Reward of

FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst fuch Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences laft mentioned, fo as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which faid respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatsoever, by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of such Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any fuch Piratical Ships or Vessels) who shall discover any one or more of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders fo discovered, be intitled to His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordships do also promise to grant, upon Request, to every Person, being a Seaman, (who by making any such Discovery or Discoveries, as aforefaid, shall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an absolute Protection, to prevent his being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, during this present War with France.
