PROCLAMATION,

For giving Encouragement to Seamen and Ablebodied Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War; for granting Rewards for difcovering fuch Seamen as shall conceal themfelves; for pardoning fuch Seamen as have deferted, and shall return into the Service; and also for taking up all straggling Seamen.

HEREAS for the speedy Manning of Our Fleet, We did, by Our Order in Council of the Fourteenth of April last, amongst other Things,

direct, that the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and of Thirty Shillings for every Able Bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fhould be continued to be paid, immediately after the first Muster, to such Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who fhould, on or before the Second Day of June next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy ; and that the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould likewife be continued to be paid to fuch Perfon or Perfons, who fhould, on or before the faid Second Day of June next, difcover any concealed Seamen, fo that fuch Seamen fhould be taken for Our Service. — And whereas Our Service doth at this Time require a more fpeedy Supply of Seamen, Sea-faring Men, and Ablebodied Landmen, to ferve on Board Our Ships of War, and it being Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen, Sea-faring Men, and Able bodied Landmen, who shall voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service : We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to revoke that Our former Order, and in lieu thereof to publifth this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby promife and declare, That the Bounties of FIVE POUNDS for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be paid to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall, on or before the Third Day of July next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as fhall be employed for raifing Men for the Service of Our Royal Navy : And alfo that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings be paid to every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shail, on or before the faid Third Day of July next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either

or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Royal Navy : And that the faid respective Sums be paid to all such Seamen and Landmen upon their being brought on Board Our Ships at any of Our Dock Yards in England, by the Clerks of the Cheque, or upon their being put on Board any Ship or Veffel appointed to receive Men at Leith or Greenock in Scotland, or at Dublin or Corke in Ireland, by the Captains or Commanders of the Ships or Veffels whereinto fuch Seamen or Landmen fhall be put, or by the Sea Officer employed in raifing Men on Shore. And for Prevention of any Abufes by any Perfons leaving the Ships or Veffels to which they fhall belong, and entring themfelves on Board any other Our Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty-Money ; We do hereby declare and command, That fuch Seamen or Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Vessels, as shall absent themfelves from any of the faid Ships or Venels, to which they fhall belong, and enter themfelves on Board any other of Our Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Veffels they shall leave, but also be feverely punished according to their Demerits. And We do hereby further promife and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, shall be paid any Person who shall difcover any Seaman or Seamen who may fecret themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for Our faid Service, on or before the faid Third Day of July next, by any of Our Sea Officers employed for raifing Men : The faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo difcovered and taken, in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy; and, at the Out Ports, by the Naval Officers, or Sea Officers employed in raifing Men on Shore ; immediately upon a Certificate being produced to the faid Principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Sea Officers employed in raifing Men on Shore respectively, by the Person who may make Discovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names and Number of Seamen procured in Confequence of his Difcovery ; and the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service, And as an Encouragement to fuch Seamen who may have deferted from Our Ships to return to the Service, We do promife Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch as fhall repair on Board any of Our Ships or Veffels by or before the Third Day of July next; and also to all such who have deferted; but are now belonging to some one of Our Ships, (in which Ship they are hereby permitted to continue.) And We do hereby further

with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships,

further Declare, that fuch Seamen who have absented themselves from any of Our Ships, and Thall render themselves on Board the same, or any other of Our Ships of War, by or before the Time abovementioned, shall not be profecuted for fuch their Defertion ; but that all fuch Deferters who shall not, on or before the faid Third Day of July next, render themfelves on Board fome of Our Ships or Veffels of War, or who shall hereafter absent themselves from the Ships to which they belong, without Leave from the Commanding Officer, shall be tried at a Court Martial, and being found guilty of deferting at this Time, when their Country fo much wants their Service, they shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall fuffer Death according to Law. And We do hereby Require and Command, all Our Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Bayliffs and Magistrates of the feveral Shires, Counties, Cities, Towns Corporate, and all other Places within Our Kingdom of Great Britain, to give the strictest Orders and Directions to the Constables, and other inferior Civil Officers, to take up all ftraggling Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall be of Health and Ability fit for Our Service, and fend them by careful Conductors to a Sea Officer employed in raifing Men on Shore, or to the nearest Sea Port Town, in order to their being put on Board Our Ships of War : Which Conductors shall be paid by the faid Sea Officer on Shore, or the Captains of fuch Ships to : whom fuch Seamen shall be delivered, Twenty Shillings for each Seaman, and Six-pence a Mile for each Man, for every Mile they may respectively travel. And We do hereby likewife require and command all Our faid Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Bayliffs and Magistrates, to receive all fuch Seamen and Seafaring Men, who shall appear before them, and offer to enter as Volunteers on or before the faid Third Day of July next, in cafe they are of Health and Ability fit for Our Service, and not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, and to grant to each Seaman a Certificate of fuch his Voluntary Offer, and to caufe them to he conducted in like Manner and with the fame Allowances as above directed with respect to ftraggling Seamen; and the Sea Officer on Shore, or the Captains of fuch Ships, to whom fuch Volunteer Seamen shall be delivered, shall pay to every fuch Seaman, after his being fo put on Board, (upon producing the Certificate aforementioned) the Bounties of FIVE POUNDS to every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings to every Ordinary Seaman.

MY Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty having received many repeated Complaints of divers outragious Acts of Piracy committed on Board great Numbers of Ships, as well English as Neutral, failing in the English Channel, by the Crews of Ships or Veffels being or pretending to be English Privateers :

Their Lordhips therefore, in order to detect and bring to Juffice the Perfons guilty of fuch Piracies and Robberies, (in Violation of the Laws of Nations in general, and of this Kingdom in particular, and to the great Difhonour thereof) are pleafed to promife a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongft fuch Perfon or Perfons as fhall, within Three Months from this Time, difcover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Acts of Piracy as aforefaid, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders fhall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

And in regard the Committing of fuch Offences as aforefaid are greatly encouraged by divers Perfons as Acceffaries thereto, who knowingly affift, maintain, councel, or advife the Committing of fuch Acts of Piracy, and also by Perfons who receive Goods fo piratically taken, and entertain and conceal Offenders, knowing them to have committed fuch Robberies :

Their Lordships therefore, in order to deteft or bring to Justice the Persons guilty of such last mentioned Offences, are pleafed to promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, unto or amongst such Person or Persons as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any one or more of the Offenders guilty of any fuch Offences last mentioned, so as such Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof. Which said respective Rewards before mentioned, shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatsoever, by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Solicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of such Offenders.

And as a further Encouragement, any of the faid Offenders, (other than and except the respective Commander or Commanders of any such Piratical Ships or Vessels) who shall discover any one or more of the faid Offenders, shall, on the Conviction of such Offender or Offenders fo discovered, be intitled to His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.

And their Lordfhips do alfo promife to grant, upon Requeft, to every Perfon, being a Seaman, (who by making any fuch Difcovery or Difcoveries, as aforefaid, fhall be intitled to either to the Whole, or to any Part or Parts of any of the above-mentioned Rewards) an abfolute Protection, to prevent his being imprefied into His Majefty's Sea Service, during this prefent War with France.
