And Our Will and Pleasure is, That Our Sollicitor do cause printed Copies hereos to be fent to the Sheriffs of the several Shires, Stewarts of Stewarties, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to see the same published; and We appoint them to fend Doubles hereof to the feveral Paroch Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.
