" the Law for impowering His Majesty to prohibit | fuch Discovery as aforesaid, shall, at the same Time, "the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt "Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majelly's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
