NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2001

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards except that:

- the investment properties are included in the balance sheet at cost and not at their open market value as required by Statement of Standard Accounting Practice 19 (SSAP 19) because the directors believe that the costs of such valuation would outweigh any benefits which might be received by members; and
- 2) no depreciation has been provided in respect of the freehold investment properties. Although this is in accordance with SSAP 19, it represents a departure from the Companies Act 1985 which requires the systematic annual depreciation of fixes assets. The directors believe that it is inappropriate to charge depreciation because the properties are held for their investment potential and that the departure is therefore necessary in order for the financial statements to give a true and fair view. The amount of depreciation which might otherwise be provided cannot be separately identified or quantified.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement conferred by Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 on the grounds that it qualifies as a small company under the Companies Act 1985.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Short Leasehold Improvements Plant, Vehicles & Equipment

4% per annum 20% of cost

Deferred Taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method in respect of the taxation effect of all timing differences to the extent that tax liabilities are likely to crystallise in the foreseeable future.

Pensions

The company operates a defined benefits pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. Contributions to the fund are charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of the pensions over the employees' working lives. Variations in pension cost, which are identified as a result of actuarial valuations, are amortised over the average expected remaining working lives of the employees in proportion to their expected payroll costs. Differences between the amounts funded and the amounts charged to profit and loss account are treated as either prepayments or provisions in the balance sheet. The last actuarial valuation was based on membership details at 5 April 1999. Since then additional payments have been made by the company to fully fund the scheme. The charge for the year was £32,448 (1999 - £9,141). There were no amounts owing at the year end.
