# STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 1 APRIL 2018 TO 31 DECEMBER 2018

The directors present their strategic report for the period 1 April 2018 to 31 December 2018.

#### **REVIEW OF BUSINESS**

Interconnect Products Limited's activity is the sale of electronic components and cable harnesses.

The gross profit margin has increased from last year on a pro rata basis, as this period is for 9 months. Competition in the industry is fierce due to global market competition. The company continues to improve its efficiency in its operations in order to continue its profitability and competitiveness in continuing changing market conditions.

### PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The company continues to strengthen its position as a leading global supplier of cables and connectors, and is "best in class" for a number of blue chip electronic companies. The company sees the current economic climate as volatile with a number of uncertainties present, namely Brexit, the worsening trade relations between the USA and China, and the continuation of M&As - but is strategically planning and actively implementing new measures to overcome these potential future challenges. Furthermore, the company continues to look at new technologies to further strengthen its product portfolio, and new market sectors to widen the company's customer base.

Due to the continued increases in competition within the above sectors, the company is continually evolving and actively developing new technologies and has established new business in the Automotive and Industrial Electronics market sectors.

### **GOING CONCERN**

The directors have prepared cash flow forecasts for a period extending to at least twelve months from the date of approval of these financial statements. The directors are satisfied that those forecasts, which take account trading performance noted above, provide a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, the company continues to adopt the going concern basis.

#### FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The company's principal financial instruments comprise bank balances, bank overdrafts, trade creditors, trade debtors and loans to the company. The main purpose of these instruments are to raise funds for the company's operations and to finance the company's operations.

Due to the nature of the financial instruments used by the company there is no exposure to price risk. The company's approach to managing other risks applicable to the financial instruments concerned is shown below.

In respect of bank balances the liquidity risk is managed by maintaining a balance between the continuity of funding and flexibility through the use of overdrafts at floating rates of interest.

In respect of loans these comprise of loans from financial institutions to fund its trade debtors. The interest rate on the loans is variable.

Trade debtors are managed in respect of credit and cash flow risk by policies concerning the credit offered to customers and the regular monitoring of amounts outstanding for both time and credit limits.

Trade creditors liquidity risk is managed by ensuring that sufficient funds are available to meet amounts due.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD 1 APRIL 2018 TO 31 DECEMBER 2018

#### 1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Interconnect Products Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

During the period, the company shortened its financial period end to December 2018, so that it will now be the same as the company's ultimate parent company.

#### 2. **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

#### **BASIS OF PREPARING THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

#### **RELATED PARTY EXEMPTION**

The company has taken advantage of exemption, under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland', not to disclose related party transactions with wholly owned subsidiaries within the group.

#### **TURNOVER**

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Income is recognised when the company's sales orders have been completed to its customer requests.

#### **TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS**

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property

- 2% straight line basis

Plant and machinery

- 33% straight line basis, 25% straight line basis and at varying rates on

cost

Motor vehicles

- at varying rates on cost

The company have their freehold property professionally valued every five years.

#### STOCKS

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

#### **TAXATION**

Taxation for the period comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Income Statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity.

Current or deferred taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted.

Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

# 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued DEFERRED TAX

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements. Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the period end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

#### **FOREIGN CURRENCIES**

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

#### HIRE PURCHASE AND LEASING COMMITMENTS

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

#### PENSION COSTS AND OTHER POST-RETIREMENT BENEFITS

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

#### 3. TURNOVER

The turnover and profit before taxation are attributable to the one principal activity of the company.

The directors consider that a geographical analysis of turnover would be seriously prejudicial to the company's interest in terms of commercial sensitivity, and as such have not included a split of geographical turnover.
