STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 28 October 1992. It is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association and controlled by the Board of Trustees.

Prospective new trustees are sought from all sectors of the community. When a vacancy on the Board of Trustees occurs it is filled following an election of duly nominated candidates.

OBJECTS AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The objects for which the company is established are:

To relieve poverty and distress of the women in Birmingham, especially the Handsworth area.

To provide employment and training for the long term unemployed women in and around Handsworth.

To provide educational and advice facilities to women in order to improve the quality of life within the local community.

The charity has now ceased activity and the company will be dissolved at Companies House by the directors as soon as possible.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

A summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year in furtherance of its charitable objectives for the public benefit is:

- Over 30 years of existence in the community providing information, advice, guidance, counselling and training services to
 women who are in need of support due to economic difficulties and social exclusion. Successful delivery of all the projects
 that have been provided this year i.e., English My Way, HMRC Advice Service, Voice Box, Health & Wellbeing Project
 and Jobs, Enterprise & Skills Project.
- With great sadness Women's Help Centre has been forced to make the tough decision to dissolve the company and cease the activities this year. This was due to the difficult situation caused by the sale of the premises by the landlord to a new organisation that proposed to impose a commercial rent.
- Therefore all financial obligations have been met in full. The remainder of the money and resources have been distributed to a number of local charities to be able to continue their good work to benefit the community.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The financial results for the year are set out in the financial statements attached to this report.

RESERVES POLICY

The charity has now ceased and all remaining funds, after settling outstanding liabilities have been donated to local charities and groups.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees have examined the major strategic, business and operational risks which the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to lessen those risks.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The trustees consider that they have complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Commission.

- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

Accounting convention

Grants received are credited to income in relation to the period for which the grant was made.

Tangible fixed assets

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Overheads Allocation

The overheads are apportioned on the basis of either staff time devoted to the activities of the company or an appropriate proportion of salary costs.

Indirect costs are apportioned on the basis of space occupied.

All other overheads are apportioned on the basis of the function of the expenditure.
