1 Introduction

- 1.1 I, J N Bleazard of XL Business Solutions Limited, Premier House, Bradford Road, Cleckheaton, BD19 3TT, was appointed as Liquidator of M.A.G Chinese Restaurant Limited ("the Company") on 24 August 2018. The affairs of the Company are now fully wound-up and this is my final account of the liquidation, which covers the period since my appointment.
- 1.2 Information about the way that we will use, and store personal data on insolvency appointments can be found in our Privacy Notice at www.xlbs.co.uk. If you are unable to download this, please contact us and a hard copy will be provided to you.
- 1.3 The trading address of the Company was 40 Town Street, Stanningley, Leeds, LS28 6EZ. The business traded under the name North Sea Restaurant.
- 1.4 The registered office of the Company was changed to Premier House, Bradford Road, Cleckheaton, BD19 3TT and its registered number is 02847097.
- 1.5 This report should be read in conjunction with any previous progress reports that have been issued.

2 Receipts and Payments

2.1 At Appendix A, I have provided an account of my Receipts and Payments for the Period with a comparison to the directors' statement of affairs values, together with a cumulative account since my appointment, which provides details of the remuneration charged and expenses incurred and paid by the Liquidator.

3 Work undertaken by the Liquidator

3.1 This section of the report provides creditors with an overview of the work undertaken in the liquidation since the date of my appointment, together with information on the overall outcome of the liquidation.

Administration & Planning

- 3.2 An Office Holder must comply with certain statutory obligations under the Insolvency Act 1986 and other related legislation. Details about the work I anticipated would need to be done in this area was outlined to creditors in my initial fees estimate/information.
- 3.3 Where the costs of statutory compliance work or reporting to creditors exceeds the initial estimate, it will usually be because the duration of the case has taken longer than anticipated, possibly due to protracted asset realisations, which have in turn placed a further statutory reporting requirement on the Liquidator.
- 3.4 As noted in my initial fees estimate/information, this work will not necessarily bring any financial benefit to creditors, but is required on every case by statute.
- 3.5 Upon my appointment as liquidator the following work has been undertaken:
 - Notifying creditors of the liquidator's appointment and other associated formalities such as statutory advertising and filing relevant statutory notices at Companies House
 - Complying with statutory duties in respect of the liquidator's specific penalty bond
 - Creation and update of case files on my Company's insolvency software
 - Pension regulatory reporting and auto-enrolment cancellation
 - Completion and filing of the notice of the Company's insolvency to H M Revenue & Customs
 - Periodic case progression reviews (typically at the end of month 1 and every six months thereafter)

- 3.6 I have maintained a separate bank account for the case and have reconciled the account on a monthly basis. All receipts, payments, journals and vat returns have been documented and held on a separate cashiers file.
- 3.7 In addition, I have completed vat and corporation tax returns where necessary and have requested and obtained clearance to close the case from H M Revenue & Customs.
- 3.8 As noted in my initial fees estimate/information, this work has not necessarily brought any financial benefit to creditors, but is work required on every case by statute.

Investigations

- 3.9 Some of the work the Liquidator was required to undertake was to comply with legislation such as the Company Directors' Disqualification Act 1986 (CDDA 1986) and Statement of Insolvency Practice 2 Investigations by Office Holders in Administration and Insolvent Liquidations and may not necessarily bring any financial benefit to creditors, unless those investigations revealed potential asset recoveries that could have been pursued for the benefit of creditors.
- 3.10 My report on the conduct of the Directors of the Company to the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy under the CDDA 1986 was submitted in accordance with statutory timescales and is confidential.
- 3.11 Since my appointment I would advise that no further asset realisations have come to light that may be pursued by me for the benefit of creditors.

Realisation of Assets

Cash at Bank

3.12 Although not shown on the director's statement of affairs, following my appointment as liquidator, I wrote to the Company's former bankers requesting that the account be closed and any funds be remitted to me. I can advise that the sum of £3,938 has been realised from this source.

Alarm Refund

3.13 Although not shown on the director's statement of affairs I can advise that the sum of £95 has been received in regards to a refund.

Creditors (claims and distributions)

- 3.14 Further information on the outcome for creditors in this case can be found at section 4 of this report. A liquidator is not only required to deal with correspondence and claims from unsecured creditors, but also those of any secured and preferential creditors of the Company. This may involve separate reporting to any secured creditor and dealing with distributions from asset realisations caught under their security, most typically a debenture as well as dealing with the general handling of communications with stakeholders, such as customers and suppliers.
- 3.15 Claims from preferential creditors typically involve employee claims and payments made on behalf of the Company by the Redundancy Payments Service following dismissal. I would confirm that in this case there are three preferential creditors.
- 3.16 The above work will not necessarily bring any financial benefit to creditors generally and the more creditors there are on an assignment, the higher the resultant cost will usually be, however a liquidator is required by statute to undertake this work. In this case I have input and reviewed six unsecured creditor claims. However, no work was undertaken to admit clams as it was clear from the outset of the liquidation that no dividend would be paid to unsecured creditors.

4 Outcome for Creditors

Secured Creditors

4.1 The Company did not grant fixed or floating charges over the Company's assets to any secured creditors and no distributions have been made to such creditors as a result.

Preferential Creditors

4.2 A summary of preferential claims and the dividend paid out to the preferential creditors (where applicable) is detailed below:

4.3 There are insufficient realisations to enable a distribution to the preferential creditors in this case.

Unsecured Creditors

- 4.4 I can advise that I have received claims totalling £50,042 from six creditors.
- 4.5 Overall I can confirm that the realisations in the liquidation are insufficient to declare a dividend to the unsecured creditors after defraying the expenses of the proceedings.

5 Liquidator's Remuneration and Expenses

- 5.1 The basis of the Liquidator's remuneration was fixed by reference to the time properly spent by him and his staff in managing the liquidation.
- 5.2 My time costs for the Period are £3,857. This represents 23.70 hours at an average rate of £162.72 per hour.
- 5.3 Attached as Appendix B is a Time Analysis which provides details of the activity costs incurred by staff grade during the Period in respect of the costs fixed by reference to the time properly spent by me in managing the liquidation.
- 5.4 A narrative explanation of the work undertaken by the Liquidator during the Period can be found at section 3 of this report and I would confirm that £2,310 has been drawn during the Period on account of my accrued time costs together with disbursements of £222.90.
- 5.5 You will recall that I provided creditors with my fees estimate prior to the agreement of the basis of my remuneration as time costs. I would confirm that it was not necessary during the liquidation to seek further approval to increase this estimate.
- 5.6 The approved fees estimate currently in force imposes an overall cap on my fees of £6,720. I would confirm that my fees have not exceeded the estimate as approved by creditors.
- 5.7 Attached as Appendix C is additional information in relation to the Liquidator's fees and the expenses and disbursements incurred in the liquidation.
- In accordance with a resolution passed by correspondence, creditors authorised the sum of £1,500 plus disbursements plus VAT to be drawn in respect of the preparation of the statement of affairs and seeking a decision of creditors on the nomination of a liquidator. I can advise that this amount has been drawn in full.

6 Conclusion
