HAPAS REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2016 (continued)

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period ended 30 September 2016. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015).

Voluntary winding up of the Charity

Following changes imposed on the charity by the government policy on increasing competition, as noted in last years accounts, the Trustees have regretfully come to the conclusion that HAPAS could no longer afford to offer its courses on Drink Drive Rehabilitation.

The Trustees have carried out a risk assessment and reluctantly concluded that they had no option but to surrender their Course Approval. The Trustees, at a management meeting held on 15 April 2016, unanimously passed a resolution that the charity should be wound up once all matters were sorted out. HAPAS honoured all course bookings up to 29 July 2016 and the office was then closed.

HAPAS have provided a quality service since 1998 with well over 10,000 participants attending its courses and during the last 3 years have offered the Drink Drive Rehabilitation course under the new DVSA regime and financial arrangements.

The remaining funds held, after all outstanding commitments were met, have been donated to a like-minded UK charity, namely Alcohol Concern.

The Management Committee's responsibility

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for the charity for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity's financial activities during the year and its surplus or deficit for the year and of the financial position at the end of the year. In preparing the attached financial statements the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- Prepare financial statements on a going-concern basis, unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2006 (including Section 4 of the Act), the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

This report is prepared in accordance with the small company regime (section 419(3)) of the Companies Act 2006.

I report on the accounts of the company for the period ended 30 September 2016, which are set out on pages 4 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of directors and examiner

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

<u>HAPAS</u> <u>NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS</u> FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2016

1 Accounting Policies

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRSSE) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their account in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective 1 January 2015)', the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

<u>Income</u>

All income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity becomes legally entitled to the income, when the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy and when there is virtual certainty that the income will be received.

Voluntary income is received by way of grants and donations and is included in full in the SOFA when receivable. The charity receives grants from local authorities and other agencies to help fund the charity's various services and, sometimes, to help purchase fixed assets. This income is recognised in the SOFA when the charity is certain that it will fulfil its obligations under the terms of the grants. Where grant income has been received for expenditure in a future period, the income is deferred.

Income from the provision of courses is recognised in the SOFA as the charity fulfils its obligations to provide courses. Income received for courses that did not finish, or did not commence, until after the year end is deferred (either in part or in whole).

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes irrecoverable VAT, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

The cost of generating funds is the sum of the costs associated with attracting voluntary income, including grant income.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the costs of an external scrutiny of the accounts and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between expenditure categories of the SOFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis, e.g. floor area, staff costs etc.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalised and included at cost, including any incidental expenses of acquisition. Depreciation is provided on all fixed assets, at rates calculated to write off the cost over the expected useful life, as follows:-

- Office Furniture & Equipment - 25% and 33% straight line

Leasing Commitments

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the SOFA as incurred.

2 <u>Legal Status</u>

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and has no share capital. The liability of each member in the event of winding up is limited to £1.
