Recognising our mission is to seek to improve health and wellbeing for the communities we serve by promoting positive health, positive lifestyles, positive employment and positive families we have this year supported 2046 clients through

- supporting 886 people not in work with health conditions to move closer to work,
- supporting 400 people off sick from work to return to work quicker than without an intervention,
- supported 85 people from Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic Communities to access health, social and welfare services whilst promoting community cohesion in local communities.
- supported public sector systems resilience through the winter by supporting 451 adults of all ages to access community support to enable them to leave hospital earlier than without support, reduce accident and emergency visits and reduce inappropriate GP
- We have also provided a social prescribing service, coupled with a voluntary sector single point of access for primary care enabling 224 adults of all ages to access practical 'hands on' support to deal with the social determinants of health.

Client outcomes include

86% of clients have seen an improvement in their wellbeing

85% of clients have seen an improvement in their emotional wellbeing

61% of clients have seen improvements in their positive functioning

25% of clients have seen an improvement in their physical functioning

100% of clients feel that they have been supported to access the right service, in the right place at the right time

60% of clients have seen positive improvements in their lifestyle including physical activity, weight management, smoking cessation and alcohol reduction

74% of clients feel there has been an improvement in their ability to look after themselves

50% of clients feel they are better able to manage their health condition

37% of clients feel Pathways services have supported them to move into work, volunteering and/or training and development

77% of clients feel Pathways services have supported them to retain their job, or move into alternative employment without falling onto benefits

Public value savings as a consequence of Pathways combined services, show savings of £4 for every £1 spent, and wider social value of £9 savings for every £1 spent Therefore the total savings to the public purse of Pathways services is £12 for every £1 spent

Pathways is recognised nationally through the RBS SE100 index, achieving 10/10 for demonstrating social value and is in the top 5 3% of social enterprises nationally for social value
