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Friends of Flintshire CABx Limited Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 March 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

In setting the objectives of the charity and planning the activities of the charity, the trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit. The charity's purposes as set out in the objects contained in the company's Memorandum of Association are:

- 1. The provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time activities in the interest of social welfare, with a view to improving the conditions of life of persons living in the area of benefit who have need by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances;
- 2. The advancement of the education of the public through the use of new technology;
- 3. The provision, maintenance and improvement of public amenities for the public benefit in the area of benefit.

For the purposes of this charity the area of benefit is Flintshire and its surrounding area.

Ensuring our work delivers our aims

The aims, objectives and activities of the charity are reviewed each year. This review looks at what has been achieved and the outcome of the work performed in the previous twelve months. The review looks at the success of each key activity and the benefits they have brought to those who participated in the activities.

The review also helps the charity ensure that its aim, objectives and activities remain focused on the charity's stated purposes. The charity has referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing aims and objectives and in planning future activities. In particular, the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Cafe continues to provide affordable, healthy meals to our customers. We also provide opportunities to local people, helping them to gain work experience, learn new skills and meet new friends.

We attended the Connah's Quay Festival event, selling cakes and promoting the cafe on our stall.

Our classes and groups continue to be popular with customers. These included a knitting group, art classes, and family tree research.

During the year we purchased new computers and monitors with grant funding from Comic Relief and One-Stop Carriers for Causes. This has improved the experience for cafe customers who want to use the internet and those carrying out family tree research.

One of our proudest achievements this year has been the establishment of a monthly Memory Cafe for people with dementia and their carers. This gives people and opportunity to socialise in a safe environment. We will continue to develop this in the next year.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

Friends of Flintshire CABx Limited continues to rely on grants, sales and donations to deliver its services and the trustees continue to address the current and future financial need to maintain the services provided.

The trustees maintain that it would be prudent to set aside an amount equivalent to three months' operating expenditure. This amount will include a contractual commitment reserve - a reserve to ensure that the charity is able to cover contracted payments to staff such as redundancy, provision for locum maternity cover, and the costs of any disciplinary and/or grievance procedures which may arise.

This reserve policy is monitored and reviewed by the trustees annually.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Equipment - 25% on cost
Cafe equipment - 25% on cost
Computer equipment - 25% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

13. LEGAL STATUS OF THE CHARITY

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and has no share capital.

Every member of the charity promises to pay up to £1 towards the costs of the dissolution and the liabilities incurred by the charity whilst they are a member, in the event of the charity being wound up whilst they are a member or within one year after they ceased to be a member.
