2 Progress of the Liquidation

3 Creditors' Claims

Unsecured Creditors

I have received claims totalling £1,403,352.19 from 4 creditors. The Director made a Declaration of Solvency to the effect that all of the Company's debts will be paid in full, together with statutory interest, within 12 months of the commencement of the Liquidation. The Liquidator is not yet in a position to adjudicate and pay two claims received from creditors and the amounts have been disputed by the director. Adjudication of the claims has been subject to ongoing and detailed correspondence with a view to the liquidator obtaining all of the necessary information.

4 Distributions to Members

- 4.1 The following cash distributions to members have been made since the date of my appointment:
 - An interim distribution of £4,545,000 in the pound on 11 July 2022.

5 Liquidator's Remuneration

- The members approved that the basis of the Liquidator's remuneration be a fixed fee in the sum of £3,500 plus VAT and expenses.
- 5.2 The Liquidator has drawn £3,500 against the total set fee agreed of £3,500 approved by the members.

6 Members' Rights

- Any members with at least 10% of the total voting rights of all the members having the right to vote at general meetings of the Company may within 8 weeks of receipt of this progress report, make an application to court on the grounds that, in all the circumstances, the basis fixed for the Liquidator's remuneration is inappropriate and/or the remuneration charged or the expenses incurred by the Liquidator, as set out in this progress report, are excessive.

7 Next Report
