The East End Women's Museum continues to capture, share and celebrate local women's stories, through research, exhibitions and events. Highlights in this financial period included:

- Progressed community consultation and design plans with the new museum building site in Barking
- Participated in Newham Heritage Month, producing two heritage trails, a family fun day and four online events to share original research around women in Newham
- Worked with women's and youth groups based in Becontree, Dagenham, to record personal stories and produce content for local community festivals
- Run regular, free, community coffee mornings and creative workshops
- Participated in a range of events and panel discussions exploring notions around women and museums, representation and public history, and gender equality
- Continued to build relationships with people and partners across East London

In March 2020, the Museum established a separate charity, registered with the Charity Commission (no. 1188775). This is a separate entity with its own constitution and different trustee personnel. The charity is the vehicle that will take forward delivery of East End Women's Museum's objectives. CIC directors agreed that the charity model better reflects the social purpose of the organisation, as well as unlocking charitable funding streams.

Over the past 18 months, the commitments of the CIC have been transferred over to the CIO in a phased manner, with the result being that at the year-end date, the CIC no longer had employees, nor active suppliers, save for those required for essential governance.

The CIC operates as a not-for-profit, with any surplus reinvested into museum activity. To this end, within the financial year, the CIC donated £9,270 to the East End Women's Museum CIO. It is the intention of the directors that any remaining funds in the CIC account at wind down will also be donated.

Soliciting, listening to, and acting on stakeholder feedback continues to be a priority for the Museum. A Steering Group, made up of 16 local women volunteers from a diversity of backgrounds, meets regularly to input into strategic decision-making and to help hold the Museum to account.

Further consultation in this period with local people included creative workshops, storytelling events, coffee morning chats, and 'town hall' events, both in person and online. The Museum has continued to develop plans for its new building and programmes with the ideas, needs and concerns raised at these sessions firmly in mind.


