STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Members wishing to become trustees must be recommended by the board or proposed by a fellow member of the charity, in advance of the general meeting. The member then stands for election at a general meeting.

Induction and training of new trustees

All new Board members are inducted by the trustees of the charity. The chairperson of the board of trustees meets with new trustees to outline the code of governance.

Organisational structure

The board of trustees meet quarterly (or more often if required) and has responsibility for all strategic decisions of the charity.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The trustees continually review the major risks to which the charity is exposed, establishing appropriate systems and procedures to manage those risks where required.

The major risk to the organisation is lack of funding, therefore being unable to meet running costs of the theatre and to develop new exhibitions to take to the public.

While fraudulent activity is also a risk, it is unlikely, but steps and procedures are taken in all relevant activities.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Aims and Significant activities

A. The Gallery is open 5 days a week and has 7-10 shows per week. During this period, 5,159 people have visited the displays and performances. There is free access to children under 16 years old, discounts for students and OAP's, with free shows for schools and social groups. The Sharmanka exhibits & performances have been awarded a Trip Advisor Certificate of Excellence.

B. Touring and Exhibition included:

Sharmanka Merry Go World to Inverness & Thurso (October 2015) - visitor numbers were 4,213 & 996 respectively. As a consequence of this tour, HiLife of Highland Council have commissioned a kinetic donation box for the Art Gallery & Library in Thurso.

In February & March 2016, we planned & negotiated an exhibition at Guangdong Science Centre, China. This opened in July 2016.

A further exhibition is planned for the Robert Burns Birthplace Museum, Alloway. This will take place in October 2016 and will include kinetic sculptures, one which is based on Burns' poem Tam O'Shanter.

C. Other projects

- 1. The Art Centre Ann Lanntair, Stornoway, has commissioned a kinetic sculpture "Am Beirt/The Loom" to be built by first deconstructing an iconic Hattersley Loom, which was the backbone of the Harris Tweed industry in the Outer Hebrides. We went to Lewis & Harris on a research trip in December 2015, followed by a return trip to dismantle and transport the loom in February 2016. The project is due to be unveiled in September 2016.
- 2. Research trip to Tel-Aviv to attend groundbreaking visual theatre "Brodsky/Baryshnikov" and to "s-Hertenbosch" exhibition & festival, dedicated to the 500th anniversary of Hieronymus Bosch whose works have strongly influenced Eduard Bersudsky's artistic vision.
- 3. In October 2015, a grant was received from Creative Scotland in order to create a photo & video archive celebrating 20 years of Sharmanka in Glasgow. The work on the archive is under way.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees have examined the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks to the organisation. In doing so they considered the reason why the company needs restricted and unrestricted funds, the level of these reserves required and the steps to be taken in order to establish and maintain reserves at the required level.

The target set by the trustees was to build up reserves in between exhibitions in order to have sufficient funds to carry out the next exhibition.

- fees received for travelling exhibitions.
- fees received for admission to the charity's theatre.
- grants from Glasgow City Council.

The charity will keep running the Sharmanka Kinetic Theatre at Trongate 103

- Exhibition at Guangdong Science Centre, China (July 2016).

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF FRIENDS OF SHARMANKA

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2016 set out on pages five to ten.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc

- 33% on cost, 20% on cost, 15% on cost and in accordance with the property

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
